THE BRAVE STAND SIDE BY SIDE AND DIE TOGETHER WHILE OTHERS WHO HIDE CLAIM VICTORY AS THEIRS. 'With whom should honour be bestowed'?

We salute the Parliamentary Democracy Party, (PDP Burma) for its selfless courage, within its own domain, in standing against western intentions, and the flagrant disrespect they display when portraying Burma to the world.

After numerous attempts by the PDP, to co-operate with the UN & other western organisations, who claim to support Burma's dream of a democracy, but instead, display attitudes of indifference and care only for their own ends, have now accepted that fact; the west is only catering for its self, not that of Burma!

Time after time, the PDP has held back its frustrations out of respect for the process of democracy and debate, which of course, never came. Instead, those who preach democracy, practise otherwise. So, it comes as no surprise when Burma's PDP, declares inheritable rights as the only legitimate party to take office, substantiated by elections which placed U Nu as Prime Minister of Burma. Right up until his death, no other government had been formed inside Burma as a result of free elections; therefore, from the coup of 1962, Prime Minister U Nu's party, held the right of office until new and fair elections can take place. Even the elections of 1990 could be construed as illegal, because it was not called by the elected government of Prime Minister U Nu, where, if the NLD claim that its mandate still stands today, would find itself preceded by the PDP's claim to office, and if any party were to act as an interim government, were the SPDC to stand down, it would have to be the PDP's electoral right. It would be interesting to see how western attitudes view that, although past indications have been apparent, considering they are well aware of the political standing of the PDP, and the pre-1962 mandate that Prime Minister U Nu's government was given by the people of Burma, and snatched away by Ne Win?

Only Yesterday evening, we watched a BBC report on Burma, where the reporter, claimed much was not known about how the people really lived inside the country, and that ASSK, was the only elected leader. This being a prime example; of how the west's media, notably the BBC, portray Burma to the unsuspecting public in the west.

The fact that ASSK never took part in the elections, therefore; was never elected as anything, appears to be irrelevant. Her mandate, if it can be called that, comes from being the daughter of General Aung San, who himself, would no doubt disagree with the role forced upon her by west!

The reason no-one other than those outside who are seriously involved in the Burma arena, are not aware of all the facts, is because these same media outlets are bombarding the western world with propaganda bullshit, because it allows them, on

behalf of the political ideology of the west, to incorporate their political differences with certain Eastern countries.

By blaming them for supporting the regime in Burma, they have an excuse to condemn countries like China, for their own human rights records, which may be a fair criticism from the likes of ordinary people, but in truth, western governments care little, other than as a weapon to use against a countries political ideals if it clashes with their own!

Under this wavering flagship of hypocrisy and innuendo, the west has distorted, hence, prevented, any serious advancement in bringing about even the remotest chance, of re-establishing a democratically elected government in Burma by ignoring the call for a round table debate between all political parties representing Burma. CAN THE WORLD STOP GENOCIDE?

Conference: October 2007; Montreal, Canada.

Note: People, like those who attended this conference; UN representatives, legal experts and academics, consider themselves as the best people to solve the world's problems, including Burma's, but can they or, do you have to be part of the equation to solve it?

Prologue, to further misery?

'Poor leadership is generally held to be both a cause and a symptom of decadence, as the lifestyle of a decadent individual is usually considered to be incompatible with responsibility. Applied to the arts, decadence implies an elevation of self-indulgence and pretension over [effort](#) and [talent](#); when applied to science and the professions, it describes an erosion of [professional ethics](#). Individual or collective [greed](#) is generally disliked in societies with strong moral beliefs, and for this reason, societies that nurture it are sometimes accused of decadence. Societies that persist in a state of decadence may become unable or unwilling to commit to their own [upkeep](#) and fall into decline'. 'Does this description ring any bells?'

The upper echelons of SPDC could be regarded as; succumbed to a decadent life style, so too the, NCGUB, and more poignantly, the NLD, more so those who have become entangled with Western privileged lifestyles.

Revelation:

Reality versus Theatre: The conference has invited, individuals from around the world, who have personally experienced and survived, the horrors other human beings are capable of inflicting upon them, and, would you believe the reason for this invitation?

'It is to present', to the conference delegates, people, who already regard themselves as masters of knowledge and the universe, to; 'a reality check'!
Well, my friends, that just about reveals all?

This little episode of inviting victims of terror, will attempt the impossible, for example; 'transferring the feelings of a mothers pain and joy in giving birth', onto the male members of this conference, and the men; to the women of the conference, 'what its like to have ones penis torn off', and to both sexes of the conference; 'the mother who watches her husband and children beaten to death in front of them', or the father, 'who is forced to watch while his wife and young daughters are raped and then slaughtered like goats'.

It serves no purpose what so ever. However; had it been a court of law, hearing a war crime, where there is a victim and a perpetrator, yes, a verbal account will have to be heard by judge and jury, but this conference in Canada is nothing more than a talking point, where if assisting theoretical interest, having on hand, certified evidence that someone has been cruelly abused is ample evidence in which to debate over, and heavens know there is enough evidence. Perhaps the pictures attached may help turn them off their all expenses paid dinner, but even then the reality could never be comprehended by such timid and self righteous individuals who jump at the sound of a car back firing.

I repeat below, what many UK-org, members have already, because at times the message appears not to sink into the egg heads and dreamers, but then, this show of ridicule proves beyond doubt, that certain people are immune to the sensitivity of the real world, meaning they're will always be tyrants!

Would it really serve Burma 's interests, looking to these people for guidance?

The only worthwhile teaching here is not to become like them!

Would it not serve Burma better if they listened to those who have lived the pain and suffered the agony for decades? People, who are academic achievers, are, also, men and women who have terrible scars both physical and mental from years of fighting and surviving in the jungle against all its natural elements and man made hazards.

On many occasions, these learned but harden men/women, young and old, would admit to me, that no amount of academic study, degrees or honours, could ever have prepared them for a life under such immense duress, nor could they have learned so much about human emotion!

How many people out there, who boast of living in a 'democracy', or, striving to create one, have tried to voice an opinion but have been denied a platform, or worse, have been demonised or even criminalised? In the UK, we have three what many call; major frontline parties, but in fact are the three most institutionally dug in. What is meant by that; like any institution after centuries of cultivating the establishment, setting practise in stone as it were, the institution becomes a way of life for many and extremely impenetrable by outsiders? Those inside the establishment become so entombed, within it; they in turn become decadent, and lose all sight of the real world! That describes most Western politicians, certainly its bureaucrats, and certainly the SPDC and members of the NCGUB, who have become encased in its web of deceit!

These people actually believe, the word decadent, does not describe them correctly, and their attitude toward life, as they see it, allows them to be without conscience therefore; impartial to decision making, where emotion could otherwise, divert equal and fair justice. [Is that not proof enough that these people are completely alien to people's suffering, therefore no amount of descriptive evidence will dent their self important egos, and are therefore, inept to debate them, and even less qualified to voice solutions? Certain individuals in Burmese pro-democracy politics have unfortunately been caught up in the West's cesspit of human complacency, which has been forced upon its own people, punishable if we speak against it. We too, have tyrannical laws which in our case; favours the subversive and the perverse, and here too, it's the innocent clean living law abiding citizens, who are demonised and criminalised. Here in the West, under the 'Human Rights act' laws are forcibly applied to the 'majority' of the population, but not as one would think, that of; the 'majorities sense of morality', but

instead, its applied on behalf of the ‘immoral minority’, so what chance has Burma got if it follows the West’s lead? Our system has become so incensed toward ‘Human Rights, it has now believes that by defending the abusers of it, all will be well, that means, allowing the SPDC to carry on regardless?

We have been institutionalised as have the people of Burma ; we both have those who want to fight its injustice, and more frequently in the West, its, complacency among our decision makers.

In Burma , the people are held down by fear, and a large military presence, in the West, it is more anger and frustration because we are bombarded with exaggerated, to the point of hysteria, celebrity and iconic worship. Pop stars who cannot sing or read music, actors, TV presenters and personalities and footballers, all genuinely consider themselves gods, all of whom, see themselves above the law. The anger and frustration comes into being, when those of us who do not allow our minds to become indoctrinated with societies complacencies, can see the damage being done, but because the decease is so embedded in the minds of the young, the establishment can do exactly what they choose, because the population in general, do not care, they are firmly locked into a world of fantasy. For those of us who want to break down the walls of confinement are held down by laws which in fact are supposed to protect us, but in reality, imprison us, metaphorically speaking!

During the disturbance in Burma, when the news was full of ‘Burma’s dilemma’, the viewing figures for Regular soap programs, and sport, increased, that’s how much the people of Britain thought about Burma’s suffering, they preferred instead, to watch programs for the less intelligent, because the news about Burma, would mean they would have to think and work things out, which unfortunately they are not capable of doing, Including my own wife, who is brain dead from constant brain washing of the establishment!

If UK-org had requested its members to attend the demonstrations in London , more than a million former service personnel would have walked the streets, but to have done so, would have meant arrest and charged under some disturbance act. In this country, as a former service man/woman, any act against the establishment, is seen as extreme, and you will be portrayed as subversive, and therefore; a threat to national security, where they will lock me up, publish lies, ridicule me, refuse any legal aid or benefits.
