A fool's errand perhaps?

The Americans are seen in Burma's capital, they are photographed with Suu Kyi, they are seen to talk with the regime, they even have a 'Burma agenda'. As a book, it may have made an interesting novel, but as we are all familiar with America's fascination for fantasy super heroes, all of which; quite naturally, hail from the US, I think we can safely shrug off hope of any miraculous arrival of one of them to save Burma from the peril it has endured for decades.

The only people, showing any shred of clever manipulation here, is the SPDC. It wants to pacify the people in the run up to the 2010 election. The regime is attempting to draw the people into a false sense of security in that, it wants to shed its bad image, and make way for a new beginning, and who better to use as their bait, but that of the Americans?
